



YEAR: 3 TERM : 1 THROUGH THE AGES

English: Reading:

We will be following the Schofield and Sims reading scheme. Pupils will enjoy extracts from authors such as James Berry, Michael Morpurgo and Patricia Cleveland-Peck as they explore a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.

We will also have discrete reading lessons where we will discuss books, themes and the enjoyment of reading.

Writing: Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura

We will be using Stone Age Boy as a stimulus for our writing. We will be focusing on setting descriptions, expanded noun phrases and prepositions.

Spelling and Handwriting:

We will learn words related to a spelling pattern or phonics sound each Monday. We will also practise our cursive handwriting during this lesson. Spelling tests will be carried out the following Monday with work set on Spelling shed to practise during the week.

- Number and Place Value to 1,000
- Addition and subtraction of numbers to 100
- Multiplication and division

Fluency

- Multiplication Tables
- Place Value

Learning Journey

Through the Ages:

History:

This project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.

The children will have the opportunity to pose their own questions and research answers related to this interesting and important time period.

Science:

This term, the children will learn about the importance of nutrition for humans and other animals. They will learn about the role of a skeleton and muscles and identify animals with different types of skeleton. The children will have opportunities to engage with practical resources such as life-sized skeleton models. They will apply their learning through tasks such as labelling, practical experiments and educational visitors.

Art/D.T:

Children will learn about colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. They will explore how artists use colour in their artwork using watercolours.
